In other words, the amount payable to unit holders is to be grossed up for determining the tax payable and accordingly, the effective tax rate would be higher.

\$ Surcharge at the rate of 15% is levied in case of individual/ HUF unit holders where their income exceeds ₹ 1 crore. As per Finance Act, 2017, surcharge at 10% to be levied in case of individual/ HUF unit holders where income of such unit holders exceeds ₹ 50 lakhs but does not exceed ₹ 1 crore.  
 @ Surcharge at the rate of 7% is levied for domestic corporate unit holders where the income exceeds ₹ 1 crore but less than 10 crores and at the rate of 12%, where income exceeds 10 crores.

 ## As per Finance Act, 2017, the base year for indexation purpose has been shifted from 1981 to 2001 to calculate the cost of acquisition or to take fair market value of the asset as on that date. Further, it provides that cost of acquisition of an asset acquired before 1 April 2001 shall be allowed to be taken as fair market value as on 1 April 2001.

Further, the domestic companies are subject to minimum alternate tax not specified in above tax rates.  
 Education Cess at the rate 3% will continue to apply on tax plus surcharge  
**Dividend Stripping:** The loss due to sale of units in the schemes (where dividend is tax free) will not be available for set off to the extent of the tax free dividend declared; if units are:(A) bought within three months prior to the record date fixed for dividend declaration; and (B) sold within nine months after the record date fixed for dividend declaration.  
**Bonus Stripping:** The loss due to sale of original units in the schemes, where bonus units are issued, will not be available for set off; if original units are: (A) bought within three months prior to the record date fixed for allotment of bonus units; and (B) sold within nine months after the record date fixed for allotment of bonus units. However, the amount of loss so ignored shall be deemed to be the cost of purchase or acquisition of such unsold bonus units.  
**Merger:** Transfer of units upon consolidation of mutual fund schemes of two or more schemes of equity oriented fund or two or more schemes of a fund other than equity oriented fund in accordance with SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations, 1996 is exempt from capital gains. The Finance Act, 2016 provides tax exemption to unit holders vis-à-vis transfer of units upon consolidation of the plans within a scheme of mutual fund in accordance with SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations, 1996  
**General Anti Avoidance Rule ('GAAR'):** GAAR provisions are applicable w.e.f. 1 April, 2017. The objective is to deny tax benefits to an arrangement which has been entered into with the main purpose of obtaining tax benefits and which lacks commercial substance or creates rights and obligations which are not at arm's length principle or results in misuse of tax law provisions or is carried out by means or in a manner which are not ordinarily employed for bona fide purposes. The over-arching principal of GAAR provisions is "substance over form". Relaxation has been provided to non-residents from deduction of tax at higher rate of 20% in the absence of PAN subject to them providing specified information and documents.

**1. Income Tax Rates**

**For Individuals, Hindu Undivided Family, Association of Persons, Body of Individuals and Artificial juridical persons**

- (a) In the case of a resident individual of the age of 60 years or above but below 80 years, the basic exemption limit is ₹ 300,000.
- (b) In case of a resident individual of age of 80 years or above, the basic exemption limit is ₹ 500,000.
- (c) Surcharge at 15%, is applicable where income exceeds ₹ 1 crore. Finance Act, 2017 provides for surcharge at 10% to be levied where income exceeds ₹ 50 lakhs but does not exceed ₹ 1 crore. Marginal relief for such person is available.
- (d) Education cess is applicable @ 3% on income tax plus surcharge
- (e) Finance Act, 2017 provides a rebate of lower of actual tax liability or ₹ 2,500 (against earlier rebate of ₹ 5,000) in case of individuals having total income of less than ₹ 350,000.

**2. Securities Transaction Tax (STT)**

STT is levied on the value of taxable securities transactions as under.

**5. Dividend Income**

The Finance Act, 2017 extended the additional tax of 10% (plus applicable surcharge and education cess) to all resident tax payers, excluding domestic companies and other specified entities on dividend income of more than ₹ 10,00,000 p.a. received from a domestic company or companies.
